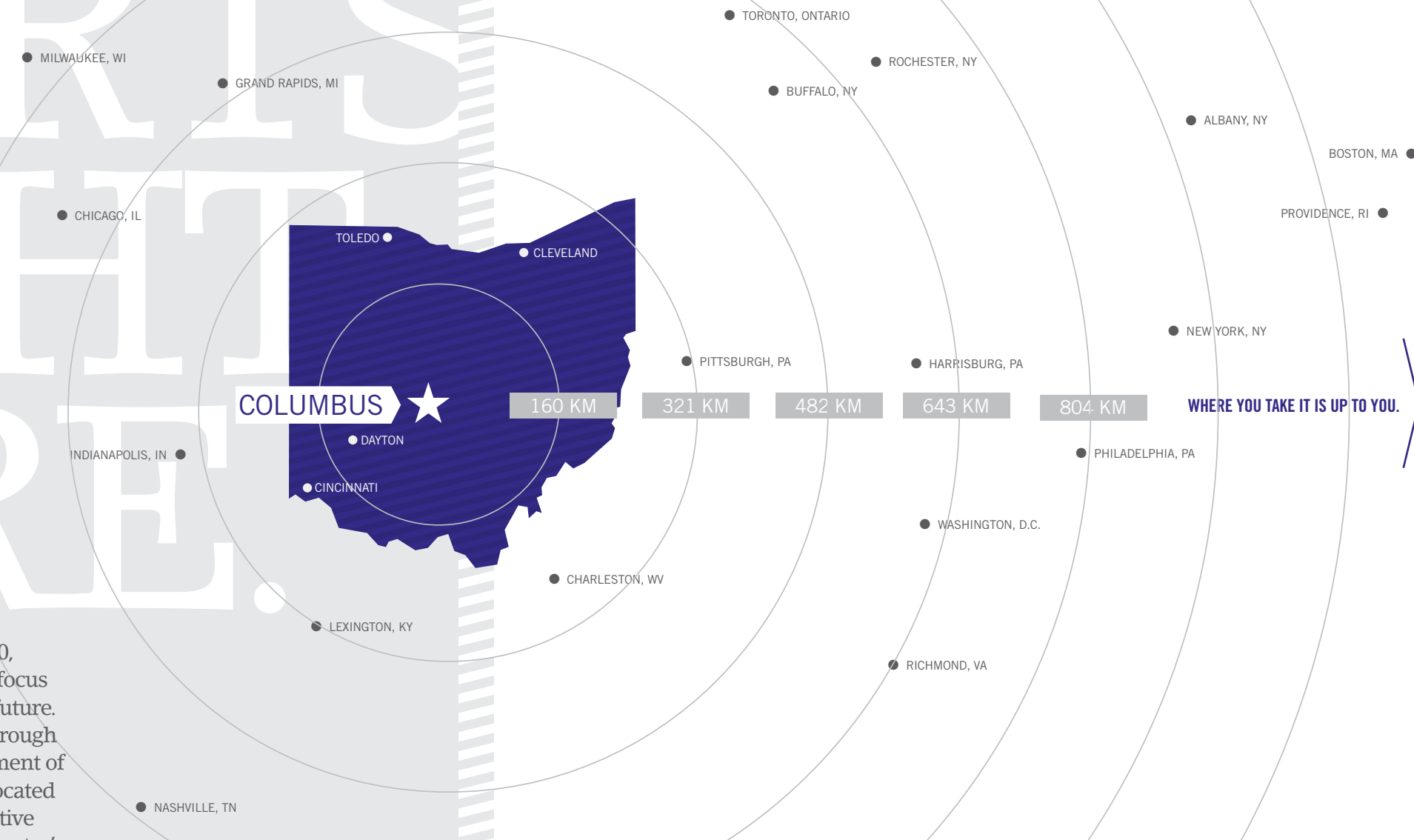
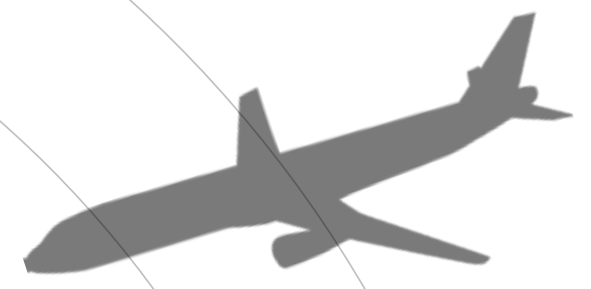

Admission Checklist for International Students

- ▶ Complete and submit online application.
- ▶ Submit all academic transcripts, certificates, diplomas (including secondary and post-secondary).
- ▶ Submit Admission Test Scores: Students must have a TOEFL score of at least 61 iBT or an IELTS score of 6. To be considered for a higher scholarship award, ACT or SAT is recommended.
- ▶ Submit a copy of your passport identification page.

Conditional admission and ESL program are available for students who do not meet English proficiency requirements.

SEND YOUR ENROLLMENT DEPOSIT

Once you have made the decision to attend Capital, you will send your enrollment deposit online at www.capital.edu/deposits to officially reserve your place in Capital's incoming class. After we receive your deposit and before a form I-20 can be issued, please submit your financial documents to the Office of Admission.

ESL PROGRAM

Whether you are looking to pursue a degree at an American university or improve your English skills for a job in your home country, Capital's English as a Second Language (ESL) program is designed to get results. With four to five hours of English instruction every day, you will gain confidence and proficiency in your English language skills while also engaging with a diverse student population.

Benefit from knowledgeable instructors with graduate degrees and an average of more than 10 years of teaching experience.

Learn all language skills: reading, writing, listening, speaking, grammar and critical thinking.

Take enrichment classes to supplement your learning: TOEFL preparation, drama, journalism or American film.

Go from the ESL elementary level to the advanced level in just 18 months.

Skip the TOEFL directly after ESL completion – for qualified students applying to Capital for most undergraduate programs.

Be supported by a responsive office of international education.

Receive personalized assistance with immigration and cultural concerns.

Join U.S. and other international students in a variety of activities, enriching your university experience.

Placement tests are given during orientation and will determine in which level you will begin. In order to be successful in Capital's ESL program, students should have previous study of English with at least two years in high school (secondary school) or a full year in a university within the past five years. Students entering Level 1 (elementary) must be able to speak, understand, write and read simple English sentences before coming to Capital.

TERM DATES

The fall and spring semesters are each 16 weeks (24 hours each week).
The summer semester is 12 weeks (25 hours each week).



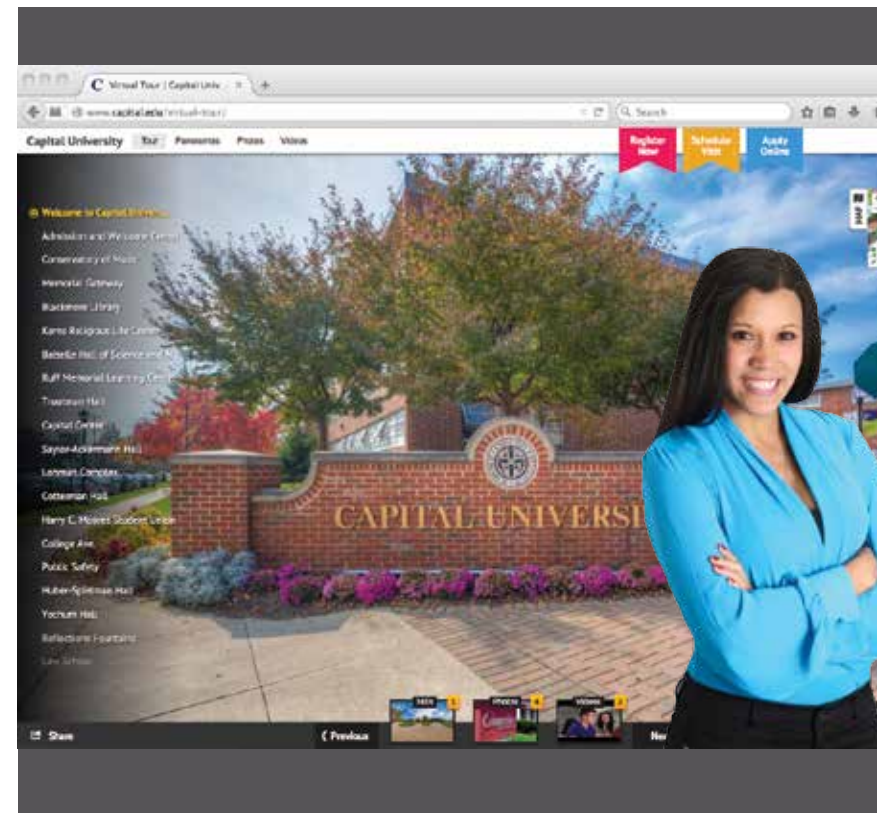
