




ARE YOU READY TO BEGIN YOUR INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE AT COLORADO MESA UNIVERSITY?

Undergraduate students may apply for conditional admission and upon successful completion of the English program are granted a TOEFL/IELTS waiver.

SCHOLARSHIPS

CMU offers a merit scholarship to high-achieving international students with a 3.0 U.S.-equivalent grade point average (GPA). The scholarship is valued at \$4,000 per semester (\$8,000 per year) and is renewable for up to four years.
